Madera Rescue Mission

We provide 3 shelters to be able to better reach the individual needs of the clients that we serve. The needs of our clients are greater than just the physical needs of food, clothing and shelter for they extend out into their emotional and spiritual needs. Our goal is to point them to Christ and provide tools for the development of their spiritual and emotional growth. These tools enable them to become independent members of society, thus breaking the homeless cycle.

Our one year program houses single women. The women are instructed through a series of classes designed to equip them with tools that will train them to respond to life situations positively and properly. Individual/group counseling will meet the need of emotional healing, spiritual growth/accountability and begin the process of mending severed relationship (such as reunification with children).

Our women and children's emergency shelter provides a nightly 30-day shelter for women and children that find themselves in a homeless situation. Currently, these clients check in at 4:30 p.m. and check out at 8 a.m. each day. The women have often learned and developed an attitude of dependency on agencies and we hope to break this attitude by implementation of classes to instruct the women in job skills, parenting skills, money management, and basic life skills.

Our Family Emergency Shelter provides a 30-day shelter based on a weekly review. This facility is able to house a husband, wife and children. We provide classes to instruct the adults in job skills, parenting skills, money management, and basic life skills.

Our men's program is a faith based drug, alcohol and any other addictive behavior modification program. It is a 12 month program with 4 phases, each phase is a minimum of 3 months. At the completion of the 3rd phase they are permitted to look for a job. Once a job is secured they will qualify to graduate at the end of the 4th phase. They are then allowed to stay at the mission for 3 months (no charge). They will be reviewed at this time to determine if an extension is in order. Upon finding housing we will supply them with any furniture or household items (as available) to set-up housekeeping.

We provide meals for approximately 10,000 or more on the premises monthly. We also give out close to 100 food boxes monthly. We assist eleven other organizations (as far south as Dinuba) who are also feeding the hungry.

We are housing in excess of 3,500 monthly, in addition, we are supplying showers, clothing, furniture, appliances, and any other necessities needed (if available). We open our doors to provide relief from the weather if the temperature is in excess of 100 degrees or below 32 degrees.
