RiverTree Volunteers

RiverTree Volunteers came into existence March 10, 2003 as a nonprofit vehicle for members of the public who want to help out in various ways on the San Joaquin River. RiverTree was started by Richard Sloan, Steve Starcher and Mary MacClanahan, all of whom had worked for or with another nonprofit agency on the San Joaquin River and felt there could be more opportunities and more done. The organization has expanded to seven corporate members all with expertise in various areas.

RiverTree Volunteers is dedicated to maintenance of the San Joaquin River watershed by working with public land owners, educational groups and individual volunteers on public lands to educate the public on environmental issues concerning the San Joaquin River watershed. The organization has no paid staff or members. RiverTree cooperates with the San Joaquin River Conservancy, California Department of Fish and Game, U.S. Bureau of Reclamation, California Coastal Commission, etc.

RiverTree's volunteers have removed over 3,200 tires from the San Joaquin River since it came into existence, as well as averaging filling nine 40 cubic yard dumpsters a year with garbage and debris removed from the watershed. RiverTree's volunteers have also planted several hundred trees each year, grown from seed and cuttings. RiverTree has an on going project to remove invasive weeds such as Arundo (Giant Reed), Scarlet Wisteria, and Pampas Grass.

East Fresno Rotary has donated 4 canoes to RiverTree. Other donors have provided tools and canoes. RiverTree can now muster 17 canoes for large events. RiverTree can offer free working trips on the various sections of the San Joaquin River. RiverTree can teach you how to paddle a canoe. Take a trip down the river by canoe to a work site, or help pick up trash as you float along. By the time you get to the take out point you will feel like an expert canoeist and will have helped to maintain the river and water quality you may be drinking one day.

RiverTree can organize projects for various size groups on the river most days of the week. Groups that start early often get to see some of the abundant wildlife that lives along the river, from the rarely seen mountain lion to frequent sightings of deer and beaver.

RiverTree does not have a logo so it runs "River" and "Tree" together to set itself apart. Its website is: www.rivertreevolunteers.org.
