FamiliesFirst

For over 30 years, FamiliesFirst has provided comprehensive services to at-risk families, children and youth who suffer from issues associated with child abuse or neglect and mental health. Our mission is to improve the lives of children, young adults and their families. Four different programs are offered in the FamiliesFirst Fresno service area: foster care, adoptions, WRAP, and multidimensional treatment foster care (MTFC).

First, the foster care program offers a wide continuum of treatment foster care. Even the most highly troubled youth can be effectively treated in specially trained families. We carefully place children with loving, thoroughly screened and trained foster families as a family-based alternative to residential placement. The goal is to find a permanent and loving home for each child in our program.

The Foster Care Program serves boys and girls (0-18 years of age) including those who have been abused, abandoned, neglected, or molested. We help children who have failed in other foster care settings,

transitioning from high level residential placements, with severe emotional disturbances, special needs children, children with developmental disabilities, and special populations such as those drug exposed, deaf and difficult to place (particularly teens).

Second, the FamiliesFirst Adoption program connects children in the foster care system with families who wish to become adoptive parents. FamiliesFirst facilitates foster care to adoption (foster/adoption) beginning with recruiting and training, and ending with adoption finalization. FamiliesFirst works with thirty counties across the state of California in order to best match adoptive children with families. Adoption and foster care programs work closely together to provide comprehensive and supportive services throughout the adoption process. Adoption is one way to help children in foster care build a strong foundation for their future, and enrich family and children's lives in the process.

Third, Wraparound commonly referred to as WRAP is a planning process that follows a series of steps designed to help families accomplish the goals they have created for themselves. The mission of Wraparound is to keep kids at home, in their community, with people who know and love them. Wraparound accomplishes this by bringing individuals together from different parts of the family's life to support them in accomplishing their goals. Wraparound services are provided in the home to facilitate stabilization and a successful reunification.

With MTFC, we provide placement and treatment for teenagers, who have behavioral and emotional problems, in the context of a healthy family home. Treatment plans are designed according to each youth's need. Foster parents work as members of the treatment team which then work with the schools, agencies and medical professionals to make sure that all the people in the youth's environment are supporting the treatment team. Every effort is made to make foster parenting a successful experience.

The mission FamiliesFirst is dedicated to bettering the lives of children and their families through the best possible treatment and support services and to assuring that those services are at all times respectful, caring, efficient, and effective.
